

The Scholarships

- **Full Scholarship** (covering tuition, hostel and partial academic and living expenses), **Tuition Scholarship** or **Half-tuition Scholarship** per academic year for each awardee.
- Renewable on an annual basis and tenable for a period of up to the normative duration of study, subject to continued outstanding academic performance.

Eligibility

- Non-local applicants (other than Hong Kong and the Chinese Mainland citizens) are persons entering Hong Kong for the purpose of education with a student visa/entry permit issued by the Director of Immigration of the HKSAR Government.
 - Non-local applicants should have attained at a recognised post-secondary institution outside Hong Kong an equivalent qualification as stipulated below:
 - ☞ a degree or a sub-degree awarded by a recognised post-secondary institution; or
 - ☞ an International Baccalaureate Diploma; or
 - ☞ High School Diploma plus a minimum of 1650 on SAT I; or
 - ☞ satisfactory completion of the first year in an undergraduate curriculum or the first year of a sub-degree programme of a recognised post-secondary institution; or
 - ☞ other equivalent qualifications* which the University will consider on a case-by-case basis.
 - Non-local applicants may be required to achieve one of the following English language requirements:
 - ☞ a minimum of Grade C in English in the GCE O-Level or GCSE Examination or an equivalent public examination; or
 - ☞ Grade 4 or above in International Baccalaureate English Language; or
 - ☞ a TOEFL score of 213 in the computer-based test, or 550 in the paper-based test, or 79 in the internet-based test; or
 - ☞ an IELTS overall band score of 6.0.

Selection Criteria

The Scholarship will be awarded to a student who has good academic standing and a good track record in community services. For candidates of comparable academic merits, preference will be given to the candidate with better proven records of community services.

The Campus

Lingnan University, located in the northern part of Tuen Mun in Hong Kong, has a total area of about 11 hectares and an undergraduate student population of about 2,600. The campus is connected to the central business district in a 40-minute subway ride.

Curriculum

The University has adopted broad-based admission to study programmes in Business and Social Sciences Faculties. In addition to the current Bachelor of Business Administration (Hons) (BBA) programme, starting from the 2016-17 intake, a distinct BBA - Risk and Insurance Management will be offered. The Faculty of Arts will implement a hybrid admission model such that programme-based admission will be adopted in parallel with the current broad-based admission. Non-local applicants will be considered for admission to the four-year curriculum on individual basis, subject to the availability of places. Applicants with suitable credit transfers may be admitted to be Year 3[^] students with Major/Stream/Discipline Major allocated.

[^] Applicants who are granted a transfer of 54 credits or more will be admitted to be Year 3 students.
