

Frequently asked questions

Where and how can I apply for the fully funded Czech Government Scholarship?

All the necessary information are provided on the website of the [Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport of the Czech Republic](#). To apply, please follow the instructions on the [online application register](#).

Can you provide me with the list of all the documents needed for my application?

Is my country eligible to apply for the Czech Government Scholarship?

The list of 13 eligible countries for the academic year 2027/2028 is the following: **Bangladesh, Belarus (democratic forces), Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cambodia, Ethiopia, Gabon, Georgia, Guatemala, Honduras, Mauritania, Palestine, Ukraine and Zambia**. If you are a citizen of one of these countries, you can apply for Czech government scholarships. The **application deadline** is **September 30, 2026**.

If I come from other developing country, can I still apply for the Czech Government Scholarship?

No, based on the resolution of the Government of the Czech Republic, the scholarship of the Government of the Czech Republic is limited only to applicants from the 13 countries listed above.

I am not a citizen of an eligible country, but I am a permanent resident of an eligible country. Can I still apply?

No, the scholarship is only intended for citizens of eligible countries.

What are the Master and Doctoral study programmes I can choose from?

The list of study programmes is updated for every academic year in spring and published on the website of the [Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports of the Czech Republic](#). Please, check the offer before applying.

Can I apply for Undergraduate or Master study programme if I already graduated another Master programme?

Graduates of Master's degree programmes can no longer be awarded a government scholarship to study at a lower or the same level of the study programme.

I come from a developing country. Can I get a scholarship for my doctoral studies?

The fully funded Czech Government Scholarship is offered only for limited fields of studies and to students of the 13 eligible countries listed above. You can find out more details on the website of the [Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport of the Czech Republic](#).

Why is it not possible to apply for a doctoral scholarship to study in the Czech language?

According to the current conditions, the Czech government scholarship does not offer any doctoral study programmes in the Czech language. This may change in the future. If you want to study in the Czech language, you can apply for a doctoral scholarship provided directly by the university.

I am from a non-EU country, and I am looking for a research fellowship. Where can I apply?

The Czech Government Scholarship is dedicated solely to promote studies, if you are interested in a research visit, please go to the [Study in Czechia](#) website, where you can learn about a wide range of options for doing research in the Czech Republic.

I am a student from an eligible country, and I am currently studying at a Czech university. Can I still apply for the Czech Government Scholarship?

Yes, follow instruction stated in the [guidelines](#).

Do I need to take any tests during the application process?

Yes, the application for study programmes in English includes an English test and a General Academic Prerequisites test. If you apply for a study programme in Czech, you only take the GAP test. In case of omission of any compulsory tests, your application will not be processed.

How long does it take to get the decision of my application?

The first part of evaluation is conducted during the period **from 1st October to 31 January**. If you are selected to become a scholarship holder (the last part of evaluation), you will be informed in June/July.
